COMMENT ON READINGS

God wants to talk to us about our lives. Today's word of God reminds us of God's guidance. Abraham's attitude toward God's trial of making a sacrifice from his only son indicates his faith and full trust. Saint Paul attests that God always stands on man's side because he has given us his beloved Son. The Gospel scene of Jesus' transfiguration also makes us aware of God's concern for us.

PASTORAL MESSAGES

- 1. At the heart of the liturgy of the second Sunday of Lent, the Church places Jesus, who on Mount Tabor reveals to three chosen disciples the truth that she is the beloved Son of God the Father. They learned the truth about Jesus, who called them and followed them. May the time of fasting be an opportunity for us to continually discover the truth about him who, on the altars of our churches, offers himself to God for us, becomes food for eternal life.
- 2. As every year, the second Sunday of Lent is Ad Gentes Sunday, a Day of Prayer, Fasting, and Solidarity with Missionaries. We would like to remember that there are currently 1883 Polish missionaries and missionaries working on missions in 99 countries. They witness the truth that God is love and loves everyone without exception. Let us also remember in our prayers the missionaries of Polish emigrants Fathers of Christs who, among other places, serve in our parish.
- **3**. Tomorrow will begin the month in which we will pay special tribute to Jesus' protector, St. Joseph. After each Mass, we will pray to St. Joseph and recommend to his intercession the affairs of our families. Saint Joseph is not only a great protector of the Holy Family, but also an extraordinary advocate for the difficult affairs of our families.
- **4**. On the first Thursday of March, we will pray for numerous sacred and responsible priestly, religious and missionary vocations.
- **5**. On all Thursdays and Fridays of Lent, we will ponder the torment of Jesus Christ on the Way of the Cross at 7 p.m. We invite you to a service in English on Thursday, and in Polish on Friday.
- **6** .Next Friday, we will pray together *the Litany to the Sacred Heart of Jesus*. There will also be an opportunity for confession and Holy Communion to reward sins. I also remind you, that day you should adore Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar. Eucharistic adoration in our church will begin after The Holy Mass in the morning and last until The Holy Mass in the evening, and then throughout the night from Friday to Saturday. In this difficult time of the pandemic, let us ask Christ for all the graces we need personally, for our parish community, for our homeland and for the whole world.
- 7. We wish all those celebrating their birthdays and anniversaries this week an abundance of God's graces and the care of the Blessed Mother for every day. Have a nice and blessed Sunday. This week's patron is:



Q. How do you determine the pledge amounts that families are asked to consider?

Q. Does a campaign commitment result in tax benefits?
