FEAST OF ST. PHILIP- MAY 3RD



The Apostle Philip was one of Christ's first disciples, called soon after his Master's baptism in the Jordan. The fourth Gospel gives the following detail: "The next day Jesus was about to leave for Galilee, and He found Philip. And Jesus said to him: Follow Me. Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the town of Andrew

and Peter. Philip found Nathanael, and said to him: We have found Him of whom Moses in the Law and the Prophets wrote, Jesus the Son of Joseph of Nazareth. And Nathanael said to him: Can anything good come out of Nazareth? Philip said to him: Come and see" (John 1:43ff). — The Church's Year of Grace, Pius Parsch

FEAST OF ST. JAMES THE LESS – MAY 3RD

St. James the Less, a brother of the Apostle Jude, was of Cana of Galilee. He is the author of one of the Catholic Epistles in the New Testament. He was favored by an appearance of the Risen Christ (1 Cor. 15:7). After the dispersion of the Apostles he was made Bishop of Jerusalem. He was visited by St. Paul (Gal. 1:19). He spoke after Peter at the meeting of the Apostles (Acts 15:13). When he refused to deny the Divinity of Christ, the Jews cast him down from the terrace of the temple and clubbed him to death. The Breviary contains a very moving description of his death. "When he was ninety-six years old and had governed the Church for thirty years in a most holy manner, the Jews sought to stone him, then took him to the pinnacle of the temple and cast him off headlong. As he lay there half dead, with legs broken by the fall, he lifted his hands toward heaven and prayed to God for the salvation of his enemies, saying: Lord, forgive them for they know not what they do! While the apostle was still praying, a fuller struck his head a mortal blow." His relics now rest next to those of St. Philip in the church of the Holy Apostles in Rome, and their names are mentioned in the first list in the Canon of the Mass.

ONE HEART ONE SOUL - MAY 2, 2021

From 1912-1930, the Chapel and Mission, that was located on this corner, was named after the Ward it was located in, thus "St. Patrick". Then, with the diligent work of 4 women, Mrs. Meagher, Mrs. Carroll, Mrs. Heffernan, and Mrs. Veroni, who went door to door seeking the support of the people, to sign a petition to grant full parish status to "the little church in the Ward".

They approached Bishop McNally with the petition. On September 28th, 1930, the newly formed parish of "Sacred Heart of Jesus", with Rev. P.L. O'Brien, opened the doors for the first time. Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish, has seen two major additions to attain the present structure. Today we, like those 4 women, are calling upon our parishioners to support our present needs, to facilitate all who come to worship here at Sacred Heart.

The "ONE HEART ONE SOUL CAMPAIGN", is the vehicle, like that petition that those four ladies used to get a parish, that we are using to get the much needed and necessary Accessibility Lift, (known as the "Harpolater")

From conversations that our Parish Campaign Leadership Committee and Volunteers are hearing, is that you agree! You can help attain this goal, buy signing your pledge cards today and supporting this next phase in the history of Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish, and help support others in the "Outreach Fund", and the Future Fund for roof and other projects.

To date, the Campaign has received 49 gifts, totaling \$145,790.00, this represents 65% of our minimum goal of \$225,000.00, with 16% participation rate. That means there is still 84% of us that need to reply, with no prejudice for those who are unable to support this campaign, we ask for your prayers for the success of this project.

If we reach our minimum goal of \$225,000.00, the parish gets 75% which is \$168,750.00, the other 25% goes to the "DIOCESAN STEWARDSHIP" portion of the campaign.

Since we are rated a "PARISH IN NEED" by the structure of the Campaign, we will receive a one-time bonus of 25%, which is \$45,000.00, for a total of \$213,750.00, which is 95% of the \$225,000.00!

Then, we retain 85% of all funds raised over the \$225,000.00. What an excellent way to raise the funds for our churches physical and spiritual needs. Hope you say YES, when your volunteer calls you!
