MARCH 14, 2021 - FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT



COMMENT ON READINGS

God always patiently bends over the sinner, as the word of God reminds us today. The Second Book of Chronicles recalls the story of the Persian king, who calls on the people to rebuild the Temple of Jerusalem.

Saint Paul points out that God in his mercy is always ready to lift us out of sin. He gave his Son for us so that we may be saved from our sins and be with Him in eternity. Saint John the Evangelist notes the human tendency to sin, to persuasion in darkness. Only the crucified Christ, who is our healing and eternal life, frees us from it.

PASTORAL MESSAGES

- 1. Living in a pandemic still poses new challenges. They are an opportunity to reflect more deeply on the values and principles we follow. Lent calls on each of us to revise our lives, to ask ourselves whether we are really following in the footsteps of God's signposts. To live is to become human, and for believers to become a Christian. It is a process that takes place in us all the time. On this journey, let us look to Jesus Christ, who, in his conversation with Nicodemus, speaks clearly and specifically: we must be born again in order to live.
- 2. This Friday, March 19, we will celebrate the solemnity of St. Joseph, the bridegroom of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This day can be safely called men's day. Let us pray to all valiant men: bachelors, husbands, fathers, grandparents. On this day, let us ask God for all the graces for them to fulfill their daily calling to which they have been called. They will probably be surrounded by the love and kindness of their loved ones, whom we also cordially invite to the Eucharist. And a small hint for the ladies of the house: a solemn fast dinner with the family in this celebration will surely be a pleasant surprise.
- **3**. On all The Fridays of Lent, we will ponder the torment of Jesus Christ in Polish during the Way of the Cross at 7 p.m. The Way of the Cross in English is celebrated on Thursdays at 19:00.
- **4.** Together with Fr. Stanislaw we wish all those celebrating their birthdays and anniversaries this week an abundance of God's graces and the care of the Blessed Mother for every day. Have a nice and blessed Sunday.
- **5** .Let us all remember to keep a sanitary protocol in the space of our church, namely: masks, disinfection of hands and keeping a distance.
- **6.** Due to the limited number of places in our church, we are forced to announce the registration of participation in Mass during the Paschal Triduum and during the Feast of the Resurrection of the Lord. Please contact our Parish Office on this matter.

Due to COVID restrictions ALL masses starting with Palm Sunday through to Easter Sunday, will require a ticket to enter. GUIDELINES FROM THE DIOCESE OF HAMILTON

The Diocese of Hamilton has provided guidelines for the celebration of Holy Masses and Good Friday liturgies. Here are the changes that will occur this Holy Week.

Palm Sunday:

- We process into the Church as we have been doing since COVID
- There will be no blessing of Palms. Therefore, there will be no palms this year. No Gospel proclamation of the Entry into Jerusalem. (Basically, a regular Sunday Mass)

Holy Thursday:

- No Washing of the feet
- No procession with the Host
- No adoration after Mass

Good Friday:

- There will be Stations of the Cross at 12 pm (noon)
- The Crucifix will be processed out of the sacristy. Father will show the Crucifix to the people and the normal-Behold the wood of the cross...(3X)
- Father will adore the Crucifix and then hold it up for the people to adore. There will be no personal adoration the liturgy.

Holy Saturday:

Blessing of the Food Baskets will take place at: 11:30 am in English; 12:00 pm in Polish; 12:30 pm in Polish. When you come to the church with Food Basket for blessing, **please sit with it in the pew**. **Do not put it on the altar.** Fr. Rafal or Fr. Stanislaw will say a prayer and bless the food.

- There will be no blessing of the baptismal water
- There will be no sprinkling rite.

Easter Sunday:

- Mass as normal (as we have been doing since COVID)
- No sprinkling Rite
