Man is Receptive to God

3. Why do we seek God?

God has placed in our hearts a longing to seek and find him. St. Augustine says, “You have made us for yourself, and our heart is restless until it rests in you.” We call this longing for God. Religion (27-30)

It is natural for a man to seek God. All of our striving for truth and happiness is ultimately a search for the one who supports us *absolutely*, satisfies us *absolutely*, and employs us *absolutely* in his service. A person is not completely himself until he has found God. “Anyone who seeks truth seeks God, whether or not he realizes it” (St. Edith Stein). → 5, 281-285

LITURGICAL NORMS FOR REOPENING CHURCHES

Church Access

Please enter through the double doors facing Huron Street and exit through the door facing the school gym.

Physical Distancing

At all times a physical distance of two meters (six feet) is to be strictly maintained.

Mass Attendance

All in the assembly are asked to take their temperature before coming to church and, with the exception of the Priest and ministers, must wear a mask.

Hand Sanitizer

Please use the hand sanitizer by the church entrance.

Seating

Every other pew has been blocked off and is not available for seating. Please sit in a spot where you have a green X right in front of you. Couples and families of one household may sit together, but have to maintain two meters distance to other people.

Collection

No collections will be taken up during Mass. Please place your offerings in the baskets provided when you leave.

Holy Communion

The individual dialogue between the minister and communicant is omitted. Following the “Lord, I am not worthy”, the Priest continues to hold up the Eucharistic Bread and says to the assembly: “The Body of Christ”. All respond together: “Amen”. Communion is received only in the hand at this time. Please follow the directions of the ushers.

Leaving the Church after Mass

Please leave the church, maintaining physical distancing and without spending social time with the Priest and fellow parishioners in the Welcome Area, at the door or in the parking lot. Please ensure social distancing upon leaving.

PARISH OFFICE

The Parish Office reopened on Thursday, July 2. You will need to call 519-822-8944 before you come, and you must wear a mask in the office. You will be asked to use hand sanitizer, to maintain a physical distance of two meters, and to attest that you are not exhibiting signs of Covid-19.

MEMORIAL DAY OF ST. MARTHA - MONDAY, JULY 29TH



Martha was born of noble and wealthy parents, but she is still more illustrious for the hospitality she gave to Christ our Lord. After His Ascension into heaven, she was seized by the Jews, together with her brother and sister, Marcella her handmaid, and Maximin, one of the seventy two disciples of our Lord, who had baptized the whole family, and many other Christians.

They were put on board a ship without sails or oars, and left helpless on the open sea, exposed to certain shipwreck. But God guided the ship, and they all arrived safely at Marseilles.

Martha, after having won the love and admiration of the people of Marseilles by the sanctity of her life and her wonderful charity, withdrew in the company of several virtuous women to a spot remote from men, where she lived for a long time, greatly renowned for her piety and prudence. She foretold her death long before it occurred;

SAINT IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA – WEDNESDAY, JULY 31ST



In the year 1521 a cannon ball fractured the left leg of Captain Ignatius Loyola, the future founder of the Jesuits. While he was convalescing, Ignatius read about Christ and His saints and thus turned wholly to God. He then undertook to equip himself for Christ's service by acquiring a good classical and theological education. The members of the Society of Jesus became the shock troops

of the Church in the battle against the spread of Protestantism in Europe, as well as one of the greatest foreign mission organizations that the world has known. Ignatius died on July 31, 1556.

ST. ALPHONSUS LIGUORI- AUGUST 1ST

Alphonso Liguori, born in 1696, was the son of an ancient Neapolitan family. His father was an officer in the Royal Navy. At the age of sixteen, Alphonsus received his doctorate in both canon and civil law and for nearly ten years practiced at the bar. When he found that one of the legal cases he was defending was not based on justice but on political intrigue, he gave up the practice of law and dedicated his life to God.
